MOSCOW

Capital of Communism since the Revolution in 1917. Moscow somehow embodies the Russian character and the Russian sense of destiny. Russia queues outside the Lenin Mausoleum at the Kremlin's outer wall in Red Sqaure. Each hour the guard is changed. The crunch of boots and the slap of rifles. Otherwise a silent ceremony, short, precise, austere, impressive. The splendid twirled cupolas of St. Basil's across the cobbled square. The Kremlin itself - that fabled palace fort of gilded domes: the church of the Annunciation where the Tsars were crowned, the bell tower, the armoury, the Faberge jewels and the icons. The monastery of Zagorsk in the countryside beyond the metropolis. The amazing palatial, undeground rail system draped in chandeliers, mosaics and Baroque bas relief. A gala night and cabaret and a magical evening at the ballet, the theatre or the State Circus - you won't forget

"The united magnificence of all the cities of Europe are but its equal" - so said the great Frenchman Voltaire speaking of Leningrad - or St. Petersburg as it was in his day. It is indeed a unique treasure house of 18th century architecture, a splendid lesson in urban planning and the city that best displays the Russian genius for

museums. It is the city on the water, the Venice of the North. The Peter and Paul fortress, the Summer Palace, the Palace Square and the Hermitage. Gilded halls hung with the works of Leonardo da Vinci, Rembrandt and a hundred other great masters and sculptures by Michelangelo and Rodin. For all this, Leningrad's praises are not widely sung in the West and it remains one of Europe's best kept secrets.

We settle easily into the life on board, a relaxing buffet car, plentiful meals - Russian style comfortable four berth compartments and manageable washing and toilet facilities and the

ever-hot Samovar for own-made beverages. At Kiosks at short halts we can get strawberries in season or jacketed potatoes too hot to handle and even delicious ice cream, while other goodies are sold on the train. And there is time enough to get into a good book - Tolstoy, Solzhenitsyn, Harold Robbins, or you can even challenge the masters at chess!



The History of a Railway



IMPERIAL RUSSIA was the largest land empire the world had known. No longer considered (by everyone) an empire, the USSR is non-the-less the largest nation in the world. These facts owe much to the Trans-Siberian Railway

In the second half of the 19th century Russia was the major Eastern European power. Having had her designs southward thwarted in the inconclusive Crimean War (1857-1858) with Britain and France, she looked eastward to Siberia and the Pacific - just as the newly forged eastern United States of America after the Civil War (1864-67) looked westward to the prairies and the Pacific.

The Imperial Far East Fleet's home port was Vladivostok. Alaska was part of The Empire (until sold to the USA in 1867 for approximately £1,450,000). Japan was appearing for the first time on the World stage. And almost every European state, as well as the USA, had established an 'Enclave' on the Chinese mainland as part of the scramble for trade on easy terms with the effete Qing Dynasty.

Napoleon Bonaparte had reached and ransacked Moscow in 1812 but the Russian winter had allied with an indefatigable people to beat him back. Before then all threat and conquest had been from the East; Tartars, Mongols, Cossack hordes, from beyond the Urals.

NOW the massive heartland of Siberia must be secured for Mother Russia. What's more, with no warm-water ports - ice-free year round - in the west, how could the fleet in Vladivostok be best supplied and how could trade with the Orient be conducted on terms at least as ous as those procured by the rival Europeans?

IN 1891 the enterprise was approved by the Tsar, Alexander III, and the ceremony of inauguration of the Trans-Siberian Railway was conducted in Vladivostok in the presence of the Grand Duke Tsarevich (heir apparent), Nicholas II.

Built in phases, by employed, impressed and convict labour, first the Far Eastern Ussuri Section was begun, then the Western Sector east from the Urals to the River Ob, then the Mid-Siberian Sector from the Ob to Irkutsk on Lake Baikal.

BY 1904 the dream was realised: the entire journey to the Pacific Ocean from St. Petersburg via Moscow could be accomplished in 16 days. By taking this route an English engineer, an Austrian ambassador, a French family, could reach the Far East in less than half the time taken by steamer via the Suez Canal.

 $However, crossing \ Lake \ Baikal \ involved \ a \ transfer \ to \ an \ ice-breaking \ ferry. \ What's \ more, \ the$ Ussuri track was laid across Manchuria - ostensibly Chinese territory. The first of many reroutings was completed when, in 1916, the loop-route south around Lake Baikal was completed and the new track via Khabarovsk opened. Only then was there uninterrupted rail on Russian soil from this end of empire to that.

The following year (1917) - Revolution, Lenin in Moscow and the fall of the Royal House of

To us Japan and the Japanese mean the oldness of Samurai values and the worldbeating newness where product-efficiency is the main game in town. Thus here we will experience the two enigmatic faces of the orient. The peace and tranquillity of springtime in the palatial setting of Kyoto and, in striking contract, the strident activity of downtown Tokyo.

Eleven time zones lie between here and London. At Yokohama we sail from Japan for the eastern seaboard of the USSR where we board the great train, first north to Khabarovsk and then through the spectacular scenery of eastern Siberia and westwards, always westwards to the southern shoreline of Lake Baikal and to Irkutsk. Aboard the train again, through the forests of Siberia using the massive bridges over the swollen rivers and over the Ural mountains to Moscow and Leningrad and Europe.

This is the rail link thrown across the world: it is both a thread striving to unify the Soviet peoples and, in the historic traditions of the world's great trade routes, a connection intent on linking cultures literally worlds apart.



Old buildings and time-worn mansions lend a beauty to this remote Siberian city. Carved balustrades, windows and eaves. The fine churches of the Holy Cross and the Holy Saviour and the drive to Lake Baikal. A walk through a small village into deep timeless forests.



Bounded by Lake Baikal to the north and The Great Wall to the south is the Mongolian plateau and the Gobi Desert. This was the homeland of the brilliant, tough well-drilled

horsemen who, for over 500 years from the 13th Century, plundered and occupied lands and cities from the Danube to the Yellow River. Theirs is a history of incredible acquistion and of towering personalities thundering across Asia; among them Genghis Khan, founder of the Empire and Kublai Khan, overlord of China, convert to Buddhism, the great Khan, host to Marco Polo. We visit a Lama monastery and the National museum then out across the grasslands to Terelj to overnight at the Yurt encampment.



The great capital of ancient Cathay. The glittering city of fabled wealth at the end of the "Golden Journey", the silk road travelled by Marco Polo. Just one of the relics of more than 3,000 years of history is the incredible tomb of Qin Shiuang, unifier of China, founder of the Qin dynasty (221-206 B.C.), builder of The Great Wall - and totally obsessed with death and immortality.





It was the end of the 1980's. Ahead, the final decade of the century and the world a fast changing place. Nowhere did this appear more apparent than in the People's Republic of China.

Were we here to witness the dismemberment of the uncompromising structures of China's Red Star Communism? Was this to be the final chapter in the saga of the world's oldest self-contained civilization finally taking its place in the one-world 21st century? Was this to be the bamboo curtain becoming as obsolete - if hardly as impressive - as the Great Wall?Or was this to be the time of tanks in Tiananmen Square?

Certainly that bright optimism of the late 80's is now heavily clouded; the Chinese mandarins having re-adopted a rather more familiar (and perhaps truer) self. An industrious people, perhaps somewhat inscrutable from a western perception and seriously, though not always humourlessly, interested in ensuring we come away with high regard for Chinese achievement both past and present. Beyond the Great Wall and out across the fringes of the Gobi Desert are the grasslands of Mongolia. This is the wild country of the wild raiding armies of Genghis Khan and Tamer the Lame (Tamerlaine). And so into Siberia at Lake Baikal and on.... 





TWO BERTH SUPPLEMENT

Two berth compartments on trains in the USSR (and Eastern European trains - Option B) and cabins on the ship Yokohama-Nakhodka (and cabins Helsinki-Stockholm and Oslo-Copenhagen - Option C) can be requested. However the chance of confirmation is only about 50/50. Considerable extra telexing and administration is involved whether or not efforts are eventually successful. Please note, no reasons are given for non-availability, nor are we advised if berths become subsequently available (due perhaps to an extra carriage added etc.) Please remember we will have done our experienced best to obtain two berth travel - and we cannot do more. PLANNING & INFORMATION DOSSIERS

PERSONAL SPENDING MONEY

Apart from souvenirs, drinks and items of a personal nature there is little to spend one's money on once in China, Tibet, Mongolia or the Soviet Union. The one important exception is meals on international trains crossing frontiers when buffet cars are usually unavailable. Here you should expect to provide yourself with food available at station kiosks etc. We suggest you allow SUS 10-15 per day for the whole journey. Advice regarding cash and Travellers Cheques is contained in the Planning & Information dossier.

Your passport must of course be valid for the duration of your planned stay overseas and have a clean page for each of the countries you intend to visit. Sorry-but no tour here is entirely free of visa requirements. Details applicable to your chosen tour come with your planning and Information dossier. Nearly all are obtained prior to departure by our visa

INSURANCE, MEDICAL & HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

We require you to be insured and there is good travel cover available. Specifically you require not less than \$50,000 of hospitalisation, medical and repatriation. You should also obtain cancellation and baggage insurance. All Sundowners agents can advise. Inoculation against cholera is advisable and a dental and medical check-up before departure is a sensible added protection. In respect of persons 70 years or more (and persons of 60 years or more for Choice 3 - Tibet) we require a doctor's letter confirming that the traveller is of the physiological disposition called for by a journey of this demanding nature.

PERSONAL ITEMS

Take only what is necessary. The listed suggestions regarding clothing and personal equipment are, as you would expect, in our Planning & Information dossier. All should fit into a medium size suitcase (or rucksack) and a generous ag. The total weight should conform to the airline allowance of
