RE: NEW REGULATIONS CONCERNING ENTRY INTO COLOMBIA

In previous years, people entering Colombia for the purpose of joining an overland expedition did not require an air ticket out, as they were supplied with a letter from Encounter Overland guaranteeing their exi* into Equador.

However, during recent months the Colombians have tightened up considerably in this respect and people applying for a Colombian visa (or entry into Colombia for those nationalities not requiring an entry visa) are likely to be refused a visa (or entry) if they are not in possession of a valid air-ticket out - despite our letter confirming that exit will be by land.

Therefore, before applying for your visa, you must purchase a ticket out of Colombia, which can be cashed in when you eventually return home. At present, the least expensive way of doing this is to purchase a Barranquilla/Panama City ticket which costs approximately £30. Likewise, if you do not require a visa you should be in possession of this ticket on arrival in Colombia to present to the Immigration authorities.

We realise that this may cause you some inconvenience and additional, initial expense, but under the circumstances it is a very necessary precaution.



The following detail and description is concerned with travelling across three continents, and with the concept and content special to ENCOUNTER OVERLAND that make the world of difference to the world of difference.




SUGGESTED CLOTHING LIST

LUGGAGE

- 1 Medium-sized, strong suitcase;
 Canvas moldable bag or rucksack
- 1 Zip holdall bag (small/medium airline flight type)
- Warm sleeping bag (suggest downfilled with cotton liner)
- 1 Woolen blanket (spring and autumn
 departures)
- 1 Robust torch or flashlight
- Penkinife or inoffensive claspknife
- 1 Mosquito net (see below)
- 1 Water bottle for Africa (1 litre)
 Plastic bags for storing clothes

Insect repellant Sunglasses Personal medical needs(tablets, tampax etc)



MEN

- 1 pr. tough boots (ankle length preferable)
- l pr, sandals
- 1 pr. shoes
- 1 Anorak or parka (wind/waterproof need
 warmer lined parkas for S. America; Sept.
 & Feb. Asia; and Nov. & Feb. S'bound
 Africa; Sept. N'bound Africa.
- 2 prs. jeans
- 2 prs. shorts
- 1 pr. good trousers
- l pr. swimming trunks
- l thick wool jersey
- 3 T-shirts
- T- Shirts

Shorts

- I decent shirt and andige Fulli
- 5 changes underwear Unknowasche
- 1 Sun hat
- 1 medium sized towel
- 2 prs. ankle socks & 1/2 prs. thick socks
- l toilet bag
- 1 money belt

- Basically the same as men with following exceptions:
- 1 pr. shorts Shorts
- 1 decent dress (lightweight) idea
- 1 swimming suit
- 3 shirts or T-shirts T-shirts
- l simple shift or dress
- 1 Sun hat & 1/2 scarves
- 3 prs. socks and/or 2 pr. tights

It is recommended that as many garments as possible be easily washable. A plastic far is useful for carrying soap powder.

Frame rucksacks, with projecting metal parts of the frame, are not suitable as they damage other luggage in the trailer. If you do wish to bring a rucksack, please make sure the frame is detachable and collapsible.

Sand/ski goggles recommended for Trans-Sahara. Mosquito nets required for Africa. May be purchased from Encounter Overland for £6.

Warmer clothing is recommended for S. America as the climate is more severe. This would also apply for minor segments of specific Asia and Africa departures (see above).
